

ESP-ATC for NEUROPATHOLOGY Leuven, Belgium

The University hospital of Leuven, founded in 1080, is a center of excellence in Belgium and a reference center for second opinions in Pathology. Each pathologist is super-specialized in one specific discipline, for a total of 13 Pathologists as permanent staff members holding at the same time an academic position in the University of Leuven (KUL). On top of training the residents and teaching at the Faculty of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences, all the staff members are daily involved in research projects coming from the research laboratory associated with the department (Laboratory for Translational Tissue and Cell Research), from other laboratories at KUL or from external collaborators, both at national and international level.
