Head of the training program: Prof. Marta Cohen (Paediatric autopsy and Perinatal Pathology) & Dr. Nadia Burgess (Paediatric Surgical Pathology) Sheffield Children's Hospital is part of Sheffield Teaching Hospitals and one of the foremost hospitals for children in the UK. It has developed a well-recognised international reputation for the care and treatment of all kinds of children's diseases and conditions. It covers a population of 2 million and integrates several regional and supra-regional services, including neonatal surgery, oncology (leukaemia and solid tumours), genetics, metabolic diseases, hepatology, haemophilia, phenylketonuria, plastic and orthopaedic surgery. The Histopathology Department is part of Sheffield Teaching Hospitals. Integration across the relevant departments such as chemistry, microbiology, virology, genetics, toxicology, metabolic, electron microscopy and radiology is well established and allows joint developments particularly in metabolic diseases, postmortem MRI and CT scans and molecular genetics. Prof. Marta Cohen is the Head of Department and a Lecturer at the University of Sheffield. The Department provides perinatal services to several maternity hospitals in the region, performing approximately 3000 placental examinations and 500 perinatal and paediatric postmortems per year. The training program will be tailored to the needs of the applicant and will cover relevant areas of paediatric pathology and perinatal pathology as well as specific areas of paediatric forensic pathology. Prof. Cohen is a paediatric and perinatal pathologist who is also trained in forensic pathology and holds a Diploma in Medical Jurisprudence (Pathology). She has an interest in gastrointestinal paediatric pathology, Sudden Infant Deaths and suspicious deaths in children and is part of the Scientific Advisory Board of the Lullaby Trust. Dr Burgess' field of interest is in paediatric tumours, Perinatal autopsies and placental pathology with large experience in the investigation of congenital abnormalities. The department is involved in ongoing research projects and numerous original studies are regularly published in prestigious journals. The applicant will be welcomed to participate in the department research projects. SCH Histopathology Department has a long-standing experience in training in paediatric and perinatal pathology. The department is a training centre of the Yorkshire and Humber Deanery and Prof. Cohen holds a Diploma in Medical Education (Eq) and is Educational Supervisor of trainees. She is also past-Chair of the Paediatric and Perinatal Pathology Working group of the ESP, past ESP Council member, past president of the International Association of Paediatric Pathology (IPPA) and former Director of the Post Graduate Course in Paediatric and Perinatal Pathology of the International Paediatric Pathology Association. The Department regularly receives overseas trainees and fellows in paediatric, perinatal and /or forensic pathology, tailoring the training program to the specific needs. Number of positions offered for each year, expected duration of the training: A training program can be offered for a minimum of 2 months and a maximum of 6 months. The department can accommodate 1 position per training slot. As it is expected that training positions will run between January to July each year, the number of positions offered will be directly related to the duration of the training program (ie: the department can receive 3 applicants of 2 months program each per year or 1 six-month position /year).

Due to the demand of attachments from local and overseas trainees, it is required that the slot is arranged with enough anticipation. Specific periods of the year when the visit may be realized: January to July each year.
